Laila, a 26 years old lady from Dahrieh, a country side of Hebron city “ normally the patients from this area need about two hours to reach our Hospital”. She is married for a year, and this is her Primi gravida pregnancy.

She had a difficult pregnancy period with frequent infections, backache and abdominal pain. For these reasons, she has to remain in bed all the time.

When she was 29 weeks of gestation, she complained of severe pain and was examined by 5 doctors outside our hospital and the last one referred her to our Holy Family Hospital.

Our obstetric doctors detected that she had severe Oligohydramnios and the baby was suffering from severe intrauterine growth retardation.

Therefore, the doctors explained the actual condition to the mother and her family as well, saying that she has to deliver by a C- section. She was given the information that the outcome of her baby is very poor and the survival percentage is very low, and if there was a chance to live the baby would live with several unresolved neurological long-term problems.

Finally, on 13th June 2015 at 20:30, JOOD was born by a C-section, a little tiny baby girl with extremely very low birth weight of “550 gram”.

JOOD was received by our Neonatologist Dr. Micheline Al Qassis who resuscitated her immediately and upon stabilization she was transferred to Neonatal intensive care unit.

Almost, all the medical and nursing team did not have a bit of hope for Jood to survive, but Dr. Micheline insisted to give this baby the complete assistance we could support her to survive. She was on ventilation for 5 days and remained in the NICU for 81 days for receiving of treatments, respiratory support besides gaining weight.

The family were involved in Joods treatment progress and received always and whenever visiting their baby emotional support from the medical and paramedical staff of HFH. Jood insisted to live with all the difficulties and problems she was experiencing during her hospitalization.

At the end, after she showed a well satisfaction of proper weight gain and a good feeding tolerance by bottle with a normal breathing. Her discharge plan was organized and arranged by Dr. Micheline with a weight of 1, 900 gram and in a very good health condition she was able to be discharged with her Mom and Dad home.

Such a big miracle and such a big baby girl


