Mr. Rutter and Mr. Herrero later met the management committee of the Hospital, they were introduced to all the work done in the hospital, and to the history of Holy Family Hospital which saves thousands of lives annually through its facilities and outreach mobile clinic. It provides medical care to the poorest of the poor without regard to race, religion or ability to pay – and patient payments barely cover one-third of its annual operating expenses. For the part of the CEO, Mr. Dominique Jacqmin he shared the recent news about the many projects of the Hospital, which will expand the reputation of our work to many places.
