**EDITORIAL**

After the recent eventful weeks marked by the reconciliation between the different political Palestinian factions and the bloody commemoration of the "Nakba", the uncertainty concerning the political situation in the West Bank and in Gaza has risen a lot of anxiety among the population and the leaders of the different NGO's. Is this agreement only an outward show or are both parties really willing to make the necessary concessions in order to set up rapidly a new government? What will happen in the next few weeks or months? Is it likely that the relative peace which has prevailed during the last years could be called into question? Will there be somebody who will defuse this explosive situation?

<sup>\*\*</sup> Justice & Peace must be achieved in the Holy Land Indeed, the perception of last week's events' would vary if it came from foreigners or from local leaders. In the past, as everybody knows, several times especially recently in the Arab countries even local leaders were overtaken by their own people. We have to be afraid of the best or the worse.

Because the activity of Holy Family Hospital is highly dependent on its political and economical environment, only a lasting peace in the country can guaranty an unlimited access to medical care for Palestinian mothers and their infants. Years ago the contrary happened during and after the second intifada, when the number of deliveries suddenly dropped by 50% because



numerous checkpoints prevented the free movement of people who didn't have free access to our facilities any longer.

While Palestinians are claiming their rights, we hope that a fair solution will be found for both sides because it is high time that aspiration for freedom, justice and peace are achieved.

As President Obama said in his speech on May 19<sup>th</sup>: "That is a choice that must be made-not simply in this conflict, but across the entire region- a choice between hate and hope, between the shackles of the past and the promise of the future." Was it only a rhetorical exercise and were these empty promises? Could it be the initiative which has been expected for years to escape from the cycle of violence?

We believe firmly that the time has arrived to act in this way. Let us pray for it.
