Holy Family Hospital marked the visit of an Honorable delegation on the 20<sup>th</sup> November 2016, the Governor of Upper Austria Dr. Josef Pühringer, the Austrian Representative to the PA Dr. Andrea Nasi, and a group of 40 political and religious personnel.

This group is called the Peace Light Mission, they come to Bethlehem annually before Christmas to celebrate a Holy Mass and light a candle at the Nativity church the birth place of Jesus and then take it back with them to Austria.

In this occasion, our visitor's made their dream come true of making a chance to visit HFH as we are considered one of the Austrian Development Agency partner.

They toured our several departments and were really astonished with our facilities as well as our qualified team, meanwhile they witnessed the continuous value of having such a great hospital with historical achievements serving the mothers of Bethlehem and the many surrounding areas disregarding their national or religious origins, since 1989 when the hospital was Re-inaugurated as a Maternity Hospital until nowadays. Also, they visited the diabetic clinic which the Austrian Fund for 4 years since 2012.

They generously donated 2000 Euro to Holy Family Hospital. Therefore, we would like to express our deep appreciation and admiration for having such a great supporters whom are always ready to provide us their hearts, love and time.





## November's Activity



### SUCCESS STORY

On 18-11-2016, Dr. Nihad Salsa' was called urgently by the guard, Mr. Shukri. A lady that we are seeing for the first time was having an eclamptic fit in the corridor. The clinic nurse Mrs Vera Hawash and the resident doctor, Nadine Titi had already inserted a canula and gave anti-convulsant medication and had put an airway. The lady was still convulsing so the medication was given again and the patient was transferred on a trolley to the labor ward. Ms Hanan Ban-nourah, Mrs Sabrin and Ms Laetitia, midwives put up the Magnesium Sulphate drip and the Labetalol drip. Mrs. Hanan Daod and Mrs. Khitam, theatre nurses were preparing for delivery. Dr. Tariq Subuh, the anaesthetist arrived within ten minutes to perform the anaesthesia although he was not on call that day.

Dr. Amir Atawneh, neonatologist and Dr. Saliba, resident doctor in neonatology were prepared to receive the baby in theatre. Dr. Rana, resident in obstetrics delivered the baby by caesarean section in very short time after the lady has been stabilized.

The lady and her baby were discharged home in good condition after three days. They were both seen in the clinic after one week and both were doing well.

Pre-eclampsia leading to eclamptic fit (seizure) is one of the most serious conditions in obstetrics. It can lead to intra-ventricular haemorrhage, renal failure, liver rupture, pulmonary edema and disseminated intra-vascular coagulation among other complications. It can lead to intra-uterine fetal death and maternal death. This lady's blood pressure was 190/120 was in eclamptic fit and was un-booked (seen for the first time). The systematic, scientific and timely approach to her management, the co-operation and dedicated work upon the whole team saved hers and her baby's life.

In many situations, all members of staff are ready to put up their scientific knowledge, dedication and all their best for the sake of saving lives.

I am proud of our team.
