The month ended with 409 babies born and 50 admitted to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit.

Bushra and Thabet have two little girls and they live in "Marah Rabah" a very small village south of Bethlehem.

On March 29th, 2021 Bushra, 38 weeks of pregnancy, gave birth to Baby



Yaqut at the Governmental Hospital weighing 2750grms but after 10hrs from delivery baby Yaqut was unable to breathe well and the doctors were worried that baby Yaqut might need a ventilator and all their ventilators are occupied with other sick newborns.

Our Head Neonatologist, Dr. Zoughbi, didn't hesitate to accept the transfer of baby Yaqut to our Intensive care unit and within couple of minutes baby Yaqut was at Holy Family Hospital Intensive Care Unit and the team was ready to provide immediate care to baby Yaqut as soon as she arrived.



"Baby Yaqut suffered from breathing issues and was in critical condition, the first three days were critical and Thank God she recovered and after five days she was ready to go home in good condition" Dr. Zoughbi explained.

HIGH RISK PREGNANCY

On April 15, 2021, Hadeel, 35 weeks, preeclampsia, Twin pregnancy, was admitted for elective Cesarean Section.

Hadeel's father, who is a retired doctor, accompanied his daughter and witnessed the services provided to his daughter. On the discharge day the father couldn't avoid not to thank the hospital team;

"No matter how much I thank the team,
I will never be able to thank them
enough for their dedication. I am so
grateful to the great medical care my



daughter received at this hospital, I am so grateful to the humbleness of the team working at this hospital; The Medical Director with the highest experienced consultant who stayed up all the night following my daughter, worked together hand in hand to save her life"

During the Midnight, Hadeel developed dyspnea and right sided abdominal pain. Upon examination and blood tests, she was diagnosed to have low Platelets, elevated Liver Enzymes and Coagulation dis-function (HELLP Syndrome). Suggestion was taken to



transfer the patient to another hospital were Adult Intensive Care Services are available.

"After Full Evaluation and discussion with the family, we took the decision to keep the patient at Holy Family Hospital's High (HDU) Dependency Unit and start extensive platelets and Plasma Transfusion with other needed medication to stabilize the mother" Dr. Abu Farha, Medical Director, Explained.

Hadeel was discharged home after three days in good health along her twin babies, Mohmand and Mina.

BABY RITAG

"On my way to Holy Family Hospital I noted that the pain increased and I am about to delivery, so we stopped at the nearest Governmental Emergency Center to make sure I have enough time to reach the Holy Family Hospital."

"Within couple of minutes from entering the emergency center baby Ritag was born weighing 3310 grams, after delivery I insisted to be transferred to Holy Family Hospital for further check-up for myself and my baby. I gave birth to my other babies at Holy Family Hospital, I always feel safe when I am at this hospital"

On April 29, 2021 we were informed that our request for financing the Project of "Strengthening Families by Restoring Health and Dignity to Women in the Holy Land" was approved for funding by Manos Unidas through the generosity of the Spanish people.
