They spent fruitful years in developing the Hospital and helping in the continuation of the same proficiency and dedication for a better coming years.




## International Day of Nursing

International Day of the Midwife is celebrated annually on 5 May, providing the opportunity to honour the work of midwives, and promote awareness of the crucial care that midwives provide to mothers and their newborns.

Midwives can meet about 90 % of the need for essential sexual, reproductive, maternal, newborn and adolescent health interventions. They strengthen the health and well-being of women, adolescents and newborns and put safe and effective care within the reach of more people. This contributes to women's empowerment and gender equality.



This international day was also followed by the international Nurse Day on May 12th, Nurses have a critical role to play in Primary Health Care delivery, often being the first and only health professional a patient will see. They contribute to research, disease prevention, treating the injured, administering palliative care, and more. They are the true unsung heroes on the front lines of disease prevention and care.


#### **BABY MARLEN**
