Since October 7, this thrice-Holy Land has been experiencing an indescribable drama.

Since October 7, the world has been upside down around us.

Since October 7, communication from the Holy Family Hospital has been very rare and is very discreet.

However, Bethlehem and the Holy Family move forward in the storm that surrounds them.

Because Bethlehem in general and the Hospital of the Holy Family in particular remain spared from the current whirlwind that dominates the world.

Yes, Bethlehem and the hospital remain spared but that does not mean they are not affected. Everyone here remains affected by what happened and is still happening and worries about what could happen.

Yes, the hospital remains spared but that does not mean that it is not affected. If activity remains strong with around ten instead of a dozen births per day, it has nevertheless decreased, as has the number of consultations (40%). The main reason is that patients living outside the urban area of Bethlehem have great difficulty accessing the hospital.

Likewise, the mobile clinic, the spearhead of our advanced strategy, is suspended until further notice, as the safety of hospital staff cannot be 100% guaranteed.

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A hospital spared but disrupted by necessarily adapted schedules (2 x 12 hour shifts) to limit everyone's travel, by providing housing or rooms for medical staff residing in areas that are too far away.

A spared but disturbed hospital that continues its mission with women in the Bethlehem region without any distinction. As usual, each can benefit from the best possible care, so that each can find a haven of peace in the surrounding turmoil, in accordance with the charisma of the Order since its founding almost a millennium ago on this same three times Holy Land.

Thanks to the commitment of each employee during this sad time, the hospital is able to carry out its mission to the residents of the Bethlehem area. As CEO, I am very proud of their behavior and their belief in the mission of the Order.

Thank you to the Order of Malta, at all levels, which has supported the hospital and its staff since the start of the crisis.

Take care of yourself; we will take care of babies and their mothers as we have always done since 1990. Thanks to your financial support, more important today than yesterday because we must prepare for an uncertain economic future that no one cannot predict duration or magnitude. . . However, know that it will be terrible in this region where most of the economy is based on tourist income generated by pilgrims.

Take care of yourself and pray for peace to return to this thrice Holy Land.

A Family from Beit Fajjar, a small town south of Bethlehem was expecting the birth of their four child. They have three girls, who were previously born at Holy Family Hospital.

Sarah was following her pregnancy at the Holy Family Hospital outreach mobile clinic, and in her previous deliveries, she used to have her check-ups at Holy Family Hospital and every time she is coming she can feel the improvements of their services. Sarah says that it is a safe place for her and her child. But Unfortunately, on November 22nd, 2023, Sarah, 36 weeks of pregnancy, gave birth to her baby boy "Mahmoud" weighing 2.290 Grams by normal delivery at home with the help of her mother-in-law. At that moment, Sarah was worried regarding her baby boy, The Ambulance, which is the only means being able to reach the village due to the current restriction of movement, Thank GOD was able to come quickly and drove them to Holy Family Hospital while the Emergency staff was waiting for their arrival.



Baby Mahmoud needed to stay in our Intensive Care Unit for a week then he was discharged in a good health.
