Volunteering

As part of the cooperation in responding to the ongoing emergency plan in the region and with all the difficulties faced by people seeking medical care, especially in the field of maternal health, the Red Crescent response is to empower volunteers with the appropriate/minimum knowledge in order to help save lives until the ambulance service arrives or can manage the case appropriately.



This is the first cooperation with the Palestine Red Crescent Society in Bethlehem, which is part of the International Red Crescent, and aims to support the empowerment of its volunteers by providing appropriate knowledge through training its staff on variety of topics.

A series of "Helping Babies Breathe" trainings are being launched for its male volunteers. In addition to another training for female volunteers residing in several villages around the Bethlehem area so that they can help deliver the mother if she cannot reach a medical centre or if the ambulance can't reach her. Many areas that the ambulance service can't reach due to roadblocks or obstacles by the occupation. This training is conducted daily according to a planned schedule for two volunteers per day, one in the emergency department and the other volunteer in the labour ward
