Travel restrictions and the absence of pilgrims and tourists have considerably reduced the meager savings of families, who are finding it increasingly difficult to send their children to school or obtain proper medical care.

For the past 18 months, the hospital has noted a decline in the number of births. Yet, thanks to the discount implemented last April, the hospital recorded a record number of consultations in 2024, proving, if proof were needed, how well known and recognized the quality of care provided at this facility is by Palestinian families.

This hospital needs your daily support, both through prayer and money, to continue providing the best care to those who deserve it, while awaiting the dawn of new days, days of peace, which will allow everyone to return to a normal life on this Thrice-Holy Land.

But let us not forget that Christ is also called the Prince of Peace, as we started our journey towards Easter in this month of March. With His support, let us all take advantage of this time of Lent, this time of preparation and prayer to go and meet God.

Social workers Day





Understanding Puberty: Educational Session

Thanks to the grant we received from Manos Unidas, we are able to introduce informative and educational sessions for both male and female students aged 13 to 14. We will be able to offer these sessions in three different schools during the year. On March 27, 2025, the first session was held for the male and female students at the Roman Catholic School in Beit Sahour, focusing on puberty and how to handle this important phase of life. Dr. Bashar provided explanations for the male students about the physical and psychological changes that occur during puberty, while Dr. Ikram shared advice and guidance for the female students on how to cope with the changes they experience in a healthy and informed way. The purpose of the session was to enhance understanding of puberty by providing scientific information to help the students navigate the physical and emotional changes that accompany this stage of life.

"I had a tough pregnancy this time around," Riham shares, "but the doctors supported me with helpful advice that played a huge role in easing my pregnancy discomfort. Their guidance made all the difference in making sure I had a smooth experience."

On March 28, 2025, when Riham felt the first pangs of labor, she quickly headed to the hospital. Thanks to a medical decision, she was admitted for a normal delivery. Her son, Leandros, was born weighing 3.300 kilograms, healthy and strong. Riham describes her birth as easy, with the medical team by her side every step of the way. **"They never left**



me for a moment. Their constant support was incredible," she says with gratitude. "Thanks to the supportive medical team, I was able to hold my healthy baby for the first time. The emotions I felt in that moment were indescribable, truly the most beautiful moment any mother could experience."



As she reflects on the experience, Riham adds, "This hospital is my favorite place and my second home. You truly feel like you're with family because of the comfort and care you receive. Every service is provided with the highest quality, and I'm thankful for everyone who played a part in making my dream of having a healthy baby come true and giving him a healthy start in life."
