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HOLY FAMILY HOSPITAL

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Saint John the Baptist, whom we celebrate this month, inspired the Order's founder, Blessed Gerard. Pope Leo XIV's address on this occasion, while emphasizing the Order's commitment to its renewal, also underscores the fundamental role of our patron saint and the example he sets for us every day in our hospital mission of spreading the faith and serving the poor.

Excerpts from the Holy Father's message to the members of the Sovereign Military Order of Malta on the occasion of the Solemnity of the Birth of Saint John the Baptist: "I am particularly pleased to address this message to you on the occasion of the celebration of the Solemnity of Saint John the Baptist, Protector of your religious Order, which bears his name... It can be said that Saint John the Baptist, even before his birth, fulfilled the mission received from God to be a herald of Jesus. He did so with radical austerity throughout his life. His idea of the Messiah, at the beginning, was still too closely linked to that of a rigorous judge (cf. Mt 3:7-12). Jesus helps him to change his perspective, to be converted, first when he presents himself to him to ask for baptism, humbly mingling with many penitents (see Mt 3:13-17). After this manifestation, John refers to Jesus as the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world (see Jn 1:29, 36). Following his invitation, two of his disciples become disciples of Jesus (see Jn 1:10). 37). And the Baptist, by giving his life to affirm the truth, will become a witness to Jesus, who is the Truth. Saint John the Baptist, your heavenly protector, must illuminate your life and the mission you are called to accomplish in the Church through the action of the Holy Spirit..."

May our mission to our sick Lords and the poor of all kinds be inspired by the example of John the Baptist and his family. Despite the circumstances, despite the difficulties, they never lost hope and always remained faithful and full of confidence.

A Journey Begins with a Smile

On the morning of June 8th, 2025, the Holy Family Hospital joyfully welcomed baby Maryam into the world. Born weighing 3.790 kilograms to proud parents Bisan and Tareq from Beit Sahour, her delivery was a smooth and successful natural birth under the expert care of Dr. Saba.

For Bisan, this was not her first experience with the hospital. She had delivered her first daughter here in 2022.

"From the very first appointment, I felt I was in a place that was organized, clear, and comforting," she shared. "Every step was explained and reassuring. The birth itself was easier than I expected. Dr. Saba is not

only a skilled doctor, but truly professional. I knew I was in expert hands."

The couple was warmly received by the hospital staff a smile at the door, a gentle word in the hallway, and an atmosphere filled with calm support. **"They treated every reaction I**



had with such patience and understanding, as if they knew exactly what a mother needs during these delicate moments," Bisan commented.

Tareq, too, shared his heartfelt impressions. **"I'm incredibly proud to have this hospital in our country. The level of care and trust you provide is beyond what we could have hoped for."** Although baby Maryam needed to spend some time in the Neonatal Unit, any anxiety the parents initially felt quickly melted away. "**But the way you embraced her and the care she received made us feel we were not strangers here. We were part of something greater a family.**"

Dr. Saba AbuFarha – Medical Director reflected on the experience: "A successful birth is not just about the safety of the mother and child. It's about trust. It's about making the family feel secure and that's what we strive for every day."





Back to the Hands That Cared

Every year, Holy Family Hospital welcomes hundreds of mothers from across the region, all seeking professional care and a safe, compassionate birth experience. But for some, returning to the hospital holds a deeper meaning than just medical follow-up, it's a return to a place of trust, reassurance, and connection.

Hadeel from Beit Jala is one of those mothers. After delivering her first child at Holy Family Hospital in 2023, she returned on June 4, 2025, to give birth to her



second child, baby Isabelle, through a successful normal delivery. Isabelle weighed 2,740 kilograms, and her arrival was filled with peace and joy.

She described her second experience as a "comfortable birth," both medically and emotionally. From the doctor to the nurses, the team was highly skilled and incredibly supportive. Their presence made me feel calm every step of the way."



Her husband, Elias commented "This place is more than just a hospital; it feels like a second home. There's professionalism, dedication, and people who love what they do and understand how meaningful every moment is for a family waiting to welcome their child." The midwife who assisted with the birth: "Every birth is unique. We treat each one as if it's the very first case we've ever worked on. That's what makes the real difference."



Hadeel concluded with heartfelt words:

"Holy Family Hospital is the right beginning for every life and a source of hope for every mother and family."

By her side, once again, was Frida Musleh not just her midwife,

but her mother-in-law, her second mother, her emotional anchor. Frida, who had delivered her first two children, stood with her through every step of this new journey, just as she had always done. Surrounded by a team of professionals and love that only family can give, Lisa delivered **Mark**, a healthy baby boy weighing **3,550 grams**, into a room full of care, strength, and quiet joy.

As Frida prepares for retirement this September, this birth became more than just Mark's beginning — it was a tribute to a woman who spent decades welcoming life into the world with steady hands and a full heart. Because
